What is the Academy of General Dentistry?

The Academy of General Dentistry (AGD) is a professional association of 40,000 members from across the United States. Founded in 1952, the AGD has grown to become the country's second-largest dental association, and it is the only association that exclusively serves the needs and represents the interests of general dentists. AGD's mission is to "advance general dentistry and oral health through quality continuing education and advocacy." Through this mission, AGD member dentists can build their careers, grow their businesses, and protect their profession. AGD headquarters is located in Chicago.



What is a general dentist?

General dentists are the primary oral healthcare providers for patients of all ages. General dentists take responsibility for diagnosing, treating, and coordinating services to meet patients' oral health needs. If a specialized dental procedure is needed, general dentists may work with specialists to ensure that patients receive the necessary care.



How does dentistry affect the economy?

Dentists are some of America's most highly educated and trained healthcare professionals. The majority of our nation's dentists practice in small-business environments in their local communities. As of 2023, there are 1,009,363 people employed in the dental industry in the US¹. Overall employment of dentists is projected to grow 6 percent from 2021 to 2031, about as fast as the average for all occupations. About 5,100 openings for dentists are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as retiring.²
